As a result, students will be awarded credit for selecting the course in the university.

BIG BASH LEAGUE 2020-21

Melbourne Cup 2020

Border-Gavaskar Trophy 2020/21







The 2020–21 Big Bash League season or BBL|10 is the tenth season of the Big Bash League, the professional men's Twenty20 domestic cricket competition in Australia, with 61 matches currently being played. On 15 July 2020, Cricket Australia confirmed the fixtures for the tournament. The tournament started on 10 December 2020, and is scheduled to finish on 6 February 2021, with the majority of the matches being played at night. The Sydney Sixers are the defending champions.

The Sydney Sixers defended their title, beating the Perth Scorchers by 27 runs in the final. James Vince's blistering 95 and disciplined bowling helped Sydney Sixers to beat Perth Scorchers by 27 runs in the Big Bash League (BBL) final at Sydney Cricket Ground on Saturday to clinch their second successive title. From the team, Vince guided Sydney Sixers to a solid 188 for six in the final of the domestic T20 league. The English cricketer played a terrific knock of 90 runs off 60 deliveries, in an innings which was laced with ten boundaries and three maximums. Their bowlers did well to defend the target as they restricted the Scorchers to 161/9 to wrap up a 27run victory.

The Melbourne Cup is the race that stops the nation. The 2020 Melbourne Cup (known commercially as the 2020 Lexus Melbourne Cup) was the 160th running of the Melbourne Cup, а prestigious Australian Thoroughbred horse race. The race, run over 3,200 metres (1.988 mi), was held on 3 November 2020 at Melbourne's Flemington Victoria. Racecourse-

The Border–Gavaskar Trophy is a Test cricket series played between India and Australia. It is played via the International Cricket Council's future tours program, with varying lengths of time between matches. As of January 2021, India holds the trophy after defeating Australia in 2020-21 by two Tests to one, with one drawn match. If a series is drawn, the country holding the trophy retains it. The series is named after distinguished former captains, Australia's Allan Border and India's Sunil Gavaskar.

India has scored a famous victory in the Test series against Australia, chasing down 328 on the last day of the final game at the Gabba to win the series 2-1 and retain the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. A draw would have been enough to retain the trophy for India, after their historic series victory in 2018/19, but the impressive side went all out and charged home, scoring 51 off the last five overs to win.

Down and out, India lost several of their first-choice stars to injury, but the second line of attack proved themselves they are second to none and the choice of venue was The Gabba, where Australia have lost for the first time since 1988. With this win India produced one of the great runchases to hand Australia a first Test series defeat at the Gabba in 33 years. India was also chasing a target of 328 for the win, making it the highest ever run chase at the famous venue in Brisbane.

Scammers targeting superannuation in COVID-19 crisis

Scammers are now trying to exploit Australians financially impacted by the COVID-19 crisis with new superannuation scams being reported to Scamwatch in recent weeks. Scammers are already trying to take advantage of the Government's recent announcement that people suffering financial hardship can have partial access to their superannuation from mid-April.

"Scammers are cold-calling people claiming to be from organisations that can help you get early access to your super," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said. "For most people, outside of their home, superannuation is their greatest asset and you can't be too careful about protecting it."

"The Australian Taxation Office is coordinating the early release of super through myGov and there is no need to involve a third party or pay a fee to get access under this scheme."

"Never follow a hyperlink to reach the myGov website. Instead, you should always type the full name of the website into your browser yourself," Ms Rickard said. In most cases the scammers are seeking to obtain personal information, including information that will help them fraudulently access the victim's superannuation funds.

"While older people are more commonly affected by superannuation scams, the new early-access scheme means a range of age groups are now experiencing these scams," Ms Rickard said.

In 2019, Australians lost over \$6 million to superannuation scams with people aged 45-54 losing the most amount of money. "Never give any information about your superannuation to someone who has contacted you. Don't let them try to pressure you to make a decision immediately, take your time and consider who you might be dealing with."

"Be wary of callers who claim to be from a government authority asking about your super. Hang up and call the organisation directly by doing an independent search for their contact details," Ms Rickard said.

If you have provided information about your superannuation to a scammer, immediately contact your superannuation institution. If you have provided personal or banking details, you should also contact your financial institution.

You can also contact IDCARE, a free Government-supported service which will work with you to develop a specific response plan to your situation and support you through the process. The ACCC has produced a series of videos with tips and tricks on how to spot a scam. and to test people's awareness of scams. The full series is also available on YouTube.
